Call to Order:

Mrs. Treviño opened the meeting at 4:30 pm and welcomed DELAC committee members to the meeting.

Review/Advise/Approve: Approval of Agenda and Previous Meeting Minutes (March 21, 2019):

Mrs. Treviño gave the committee members some time to review the minutes from the previous meeting held on March 21, 2019. Mrs. Treviño asked committee members if they had any questions regarding the minutes being reviewed. There were no questions, or comments. Mrs. Fausto made the motion to approve the minutes from the meeting held on March 21, 2019.

Review/Advise/Approve: 2019-20 LCAP Addendum Draft:

Mrs. Treviño explained the 2019-20 LCAP Addendum Draft is how our district provides services to homeless students. She explained what identifies a student as homeless and gave an example of some materials provided such as clothing, backpacks, and school materials. Our district also provides shelter at a hotel/motel up to 12 days. We also provide transportation to students to and from school. Mrs. Treviño explained it also helps with student transition such as students going from elementary school to middle school then to high school. Our school district has a partnership with Fresno State, Reedley College, and College of the Sequoias. Mrs. Treviño explained our school district provided professional development for staff for example AVID/College & Career. Mrs. Treviño also explained this was the first time our school district does this. We would submit it to the board for approval then to the California Department of Education (CDE). Mrs. Treviño asked committee members if they had any questions or comments regarding the 2019-20 LCAP Addendum Draft. There were no questions or comments. Mrs. Iglesias made the motion to approve, seconded by Mrs. Fausto. All were in favor.

Review/Approve: Updated Categorical Budgets 2019-20:

Mrs. Treviño explained to committee members there were updates in the Categorical Budgets for the 2019-20 school year. Full Steam Ahead and Art would be available for summer school. Mrs. Treviño asked committee

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members if they had any questions, or comments regarding the updates to the Categorical Budgets. There were no questions or comments. Mrs. Iglesias made the first motion to approve, seconded by Mrs. Fausto. All were in favor.

Review/Approve: Consolidated Application:

Mrs. Treviño explained to committee members the Consolidated Application falls within Title I, Title II, Title III, Title IV, and Title V. The state of California gives money to our school district but our school district can only spend the money received according to what the state allows us to, for example; Money given for English Language Learners can only be spent for English Language Learners, money for Immigrants can only be spent on immigrant students. Mrs. Treviño asked committee members if they have any questions or concerns. There were no questions or concerns. Mrs. Fausto made the first motion to approve, seconded by Mrs. Iglesias. All were in favor.

Review/Approve: Title I Survey Results:

Mrs. Treviño explained the Title I Survey is to give our school district input of what our community members/parents felt would benefit our students, for example how our school district can help students. Mrs. Treviño asked if there were any questions or concerns. There were no questions or concerns. Mrs. Fausto made the first motion to approve, seconded by Mrs. Iglesias. All were in favor.

Review/Approve: 2018-19 LCAP DRAFT:

Mrs. Treviño explained the 2018-19 LCAP DRAFT has three main goals. The first goal is to achieve academic excellence and meet the needs of all students in a safe and supportive environment so that all students will be college, career, and community ready and prepared to compete in a global economy. Mrs. Treviño explained our school district will continue to provide additional staff to support positive behavior on campus and to ensure students are learning in a safe environment and engaged in school. In addition, our school district will continue to purchase supplemental instructional materials and to teach using performance standards, including supplemental materials for ELs to gain academic content knowledge and English Language proficiency. Our school district will continue to provide early learning support for children 0-5 years of age to enable them to enter school ready to learn, including our ELs. The second goal is to build human capacity by investing in training, coaching, and setting expectations for students, parents, staff and the Board to support student achievement by providing support to teachers through mentoring to ensure highly qualified teachers, and provide ongoing training and professional learning to all staff (certificated, classified, and management) to improve efficacy in meeting the needs of all of our students and maintaining exemplary schools and programs to classified and certificated staff to support goals and outcomes. Finally Mrs. Treviño explained goal number three is to create efficient and effective systems that are innovative, accountable and proactive to support 21st century learning by providing instructional and operational technology for all students. Maintain and support technology systems to ensure students and employees access to effective technology to support the district's goals. Mrs. Treviño asked if there were any questions or concerns. There were no questions or concerns. Mrs. Iglesias made the first motion to approve, seconded by Mrs. Fausto. All were in favor.
